Badminton

Class division

- **Mix** “Open Class” for all ages
- **Mix** “Senior Class” for 40 years and over (40+)

Game model

- **Mix Open Class:**
 1. A team consists of 3 players - (maximum 6 players). The team contains 1 woman and 2 men - (max. 2 women and 4 men) The team composition can be changed before starting a new team match.
 2. Each match has 4 individual games in the following order:
 - a) 1 men’s singles,
 - b) 1 women’s singles,
 - c) 1 men’s doubles and
 - d) 1 mixed doubles (“mixed open”)
- **Mix Senior Class:**
 1. A team consists of 4 players - (maximum 8 players). The team contains 2 women and 2 men - (max. 4 women and 4 men) The team composition can be changed before starting a new team match.
 2. Each match has 4 individual games in the following order:
 - a) 2 mixed,
 - b) 1 men’s
 - c) 1 women’s doubles (“mixed senior”).

Matches

1. The tournament will be held under the ABC Pool/CUP system to even out differences in strength between the participating teams. The participating teams will be divided into groups made up of 3 to 5 teams in the preliminary round.
2. The team, which has won the most games in a match, is the winner.
3. The scoring within the group follows the points system (win 2 – draw 1 – loss 0 points).
4. The teams are ranked in each pool on points, so that the team with most points is no. 1 and the next best team
 - a. If 2 teams are tied, the games they have played together decide the result.
 - b. If the teams are still tied, the team with the biggest difference between games won and games lost the difference between sets and then in game point, is the winner.
5. Games can be played without a referee. The players themselves judge the individual games.
6. The game is played with approved feather shuttlecocks.

Playing time

1. Games are played to the best of 3 sets.
2. Each set is played up to 21 points. At 20-all the two point lead rule will for time reasons NOT be applied.



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Rules

1. Unless otherwise specified, the rules of the Badminton World Federation (BWF) apply.
2. Each match consists of the best of 3 games of 21 points without extra time.
3. The interval between the first and second set is 90 seconds, and between the second and third set 3 minutes.
4. The teams are requested to report to the tournament director 30 minutes before their first match is to begin.
5. The organizer will provide the shuttles; please note that only non-marking indoor shoes are permitted.
6. Even a referee must apply the international rules.
7. Detailed game rules are published in the tournament program.
