## Darts

### Individual Tournament

### Game model individual Tournament

1. The singles will be played as double-elimination tournaments (501 master out, best-of-three)
2. Each game is played with a referee from the group (the non-player).
3. The individual tournament will be a double-elimination tournament with a winner's and loser's bracket (repechage). That means that a player is only out after he/she has lost twice.
4. Up to the finals of both brackets (loser's and winner's), games will be played on 2 won legs; from the finals onwards, on 3 won legs ("best of five"). Women and men will compete separately.

### Game model Team tournament

1. A team consists of 4 players (men and/or women).
2. Each match has 6 individual games in the following order:
  - Single 1
  - Single 2
  - Double 1
  - Single 3
  - Single 4
  - Double 2
3. The preliminary round in the team tournament will be played in groups of 3 to 5 teams using the round-robin format. Then the elimination system will be applied through to the finals (501 double out, best-of-three)
4. Games are played using referees provided by the teams on an alternate basis.



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## Matches

- 1) The tournament will be held under the ABC Pool/CUP system to even out differences in strength between the participating teams. The scoring within the group follows the points system: win 2 points – loss 0 points
- 2) a) The player/team who has won the most games is the winner.  
b) The players are ranked in each pool on points, so that the player with most points is no.1 and the next best is no.2 etc.
  - If 2 players/ teams are tied, the games they have played together decide the result.
  - If the players are still tied, the player with the biggest difference between legs won and legs lost, is the winner.
  - If the players are still tied then a decider has to be played.

The players have to play 501 flying start with double exit using an equal amount of darts.

- 3) After completion of the group phase, the competition continues in the knockout format up to the finals.

## Playing time

POOL-games are played best of 3 legs and CUP-games are played best of 5 legs.

## Rules

1. Unless otherwise specified, the rules of the International Dart Federation apply.
2. Only soft-tip darts may be used (max. 18g).
3. The tournament will be played on classical dartboards
4. Even a referee must apply the international rules.
5. Detailed game rules are published in the tournament program.
