Game model individual Tournament

1. All events are run on knockout basis (single-elimination)
2. All legs are 501 straight start, finish on a double.
3. The player who throws closest to the bull, will start the game. The first name at the draw, will throw first for the bull. If there is a tie, the decisive leg is started by the player who started the match
4. Men & Women singles are best of 3 legs 501. Final is best of 5 legs.
5. Each game is played with a referee (marker) who have the responsibility to keep the score of the game.
6. Players and Markers will not be called in. Is their responsibility to know when and where. In every dartboard there is the playing schedule. Players and Markers have to check when is the next game to play/mark
7. The winner of a game must write the result on the schedule
8. The player who lost the match must remain at the board to mark the next match.
9. If a player is not at the board at the official time of his match and the organizers called him 2 times, that player will loose his game
10. For the 1st round matches, the player that is the last on every board sheet must mark the first match.
11. Smoking, drinking and eating are not allowed in the playing area.
12. Women and men will compete separately.
 - a. The organizers reserve the right to alter the schedule and playing format.

Game model Team tournament

1. A team consists of 4 players (men and/or women).
2. Each match has 6 individual games in the following order:
 - Single 1
 - Single 2



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- Double 1
 - Single 3
 - Single 4
 - Double 2
3. The preliminary round in the team tournament will be played in groups of 3 to 5 teams using the round-robin format. Then the elimination system will be applied through to the finals (501 double out, best-of-three)
 4. Each game is played with a referee (marker) who have the responsibility to keep the score of the game.

Matches

- The tournament will be held under the ABC Pool/CUP system to even out differences in strength between the participating teams. The scoring within the group follows the points system: win 2 points – loss 0 points
- a) The player/team who has won the most games is the winner.
- b) The players are ranked in each pool on points, so that the player with most points is no.1 and the next best is no.2 etc.
 - If 2 players/ teams are tied, the games they have played together decide the result.
 - If the players are still tied, the player with the biggest difference between legs won and legs lost, is the winner.
 - If the players are still tied then a decider has to be played.

The players have to play 501 flying start with double exit using an equal amount of darts.

- After completion of the group phase, the competition continues in the knockout format up to the finals.
- The Player/Team who has written first at the draw, will start first the game. After first game (single 1) will start the next game (single 2) the player of the other team. That will continued until the finish of the match.

Playing time

Group games are played best of 3 legs and Knockout games are played best of 5 legs.

Rules

1. Unless otherwise specified, the rules of the World Dart Federation apply.
2. Only steeldarts will be used .
3. The tournament will be played on classical dartboards
4. Even a Marker must apply the international rules.
5. Detailed game rules are published in the tournament program.
